Towson at Digital Harbor:

Since Spring 2007, graduate assistant, Kellise Williamson has been providing support to high school students at Digital Harbor High School. She gathers several students from each Algebra I class to review practice problems from the Maryland High School Assessment Exam in addition to providing games and study tools to help them prepare.

Kellise visits each special education Algebra class to provide additional academic support to the students. She answers questions regarding test questions, particularly BCRs and ECRs and offers problem solving techniques and study skills to help increase passing scores. Also, she assists the students with class and homework assignments.

Towson at Mervo:

Beginning in Spring 2008, graduate assistant, Sara Hermes will tutor students twice a week in preparation for the Maryland High School Assessment Exam. Sara will provide additional academic support to Algebra teachers by assisting with class work and homework assignments, answering questions, and providing the students with problem solving techniques and study skills to help them succeed.
