### **Hazardous Waste Generator Training**

Hazardous Waste Generator Training is a one-time, mandatory training class presented by Environmental Health & Safety for all Towson University employees who may potentially generate or dispose of any regulated hazardous chemical wastes on campus.

Training was made mandatory in February 2001 by Presidential Policy as a direct result of increased enforcement activity at colleges and universities by the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) and the Maryland Department of the Environment (MDE) and recommendations from the University System of Maryland based upon audits of the University Hazardous Waste Program.

Class objectives include defining what are regulated as hazardous wastes and Generator responsibilities to include the proper packaging, labeling and storage, and campus hazardous waste disposal procedures.

The class is offered to faculty and staff on the third Thursday of every month in 7400 York Road, room 302 from 2:00 p.m. - 3:30 p.m. Additional classes may be scheduled as needed. Advance registration is required. There is no charge for the class. (There is a minimum class enrollment of four.) A mandatory prerequisite for this class is the satisfactory completion of EHS's "Right-to Know" SkillPort course.
