## **Crime Alert:**

### **Suspicious Condition**

On Monday, February 23, 2009 at approximately 4:40 pm a Towson University Student reported, via an e-mail, that on Sunday, February 22, 2009 at approximately 10:30 pm she was approached on Osler Dr. by an African-American male, at least in his 50's, who was driving an older model maroon Toyota sedan with a headlight out. The student reported that when she was approached she moved away from the subject's vehicle and ran across Osler Drive towards Millennium Hall at which time she observed the subject turn his vehicle around and drive into the entrance to Millennium Hall. The student ran into Millennium Hall and once inside did not observe the subject in the area any longer.

### **Timely Warning**

The following e-mail is being sent due to the number of Towson University Students living in the Fairways at Towson Community.

Baltimore County Police have identified a man who was shot to death inside his home sometime between February 13, 2009, and February 14, 2009 at around 3 p.m. in the 7000-block of Lachlan Circle, 21239. He is identified as Daniel Ho Colverston, 24.

Police were called at approximately 2:56 p.m. yesterday after receiving a call for a cardiac arrest. When they arrived they found Colverston dead at the scene. This morning an autopsy was completed that revealed that the victim died as a result of a gunshot wound.

The victim was last seen alive on February 13. Investigators have no suspects or motive for the killing at this time.
