### Navigate Your PowerPoint 2007 Slide Show Effectively

It is vital to any presenter using PowerPoint to know how to navigate a slide show prior to giving the presentation to an audience. The following list offers several ways to navigate a slide show. They are listed in order of importance.

To Perform this Action:	Do the Following:
Start the Slide Show from the First Slide (beginning)	On the Ribbon, select the <b>Slide Show tab</b> , then click the <b>From Beginning</b> button (or press <b>F5</b> on the keyboard).
Start the Slide Show from the Current Slide	On the Ribbon, select the <b>Slide Show tab</b> , then click the <b>From Current Slide</b> button (or press <b>Shft+F5</b> on the keyboard).
Display the Next Slide	Many options: Left-click the mouse, or press <b>Enter</b> ; <b>spacebar</b> ; <b>right arrow</b> ; <b>down arrow</b> ; or <b>Page Down</b> key on the keyboard.
Display the Previous Slide	Many options: Press <b>backspace</b> ; <b>left arrow</b> ; <b>up arrow</b> ; or <b>Page Up</b> key on the keyboard.
End the Slide Show	Press <b>Esc</b> on the keyboard.
To move to a specific slide during the Slide Show	Type the slide number, e.g. 5, and press <b>Enter on the keyboard</b> OR Right-click the slide show, select <b>Go to Slide &gt; "Slide Name"</b> .
Return to Slide 1	Press the <b>Home</b> key on the keyboard.
Display the Slide Show shortcut menu	Right-click anywhere on the slide during the slide show, then click the desired command.
Unhide/Display a hidden slide	Display the slide that immediately precedes the hidden slide, then press <b>H</b> on the keyboard.
Make the entire screen black	Press <b>B</b> on the keyboard. Press <b>B</b> again to turn off.
Make the entire screen white	Press <b>W</b> on the keyboard. Press <b>W</b> again to turn off.
Change your mouse pointer to a pen for annotation	Press <b>Ctrl+P</b> on the keyboard.
Erase your pen annotations	Press <b>Ctrl+E</b> on the keyboard.
Change your pen back to the mouse pointer	Press <b>Ctrl+A</b> on the keyboard.
Hide your mouse pointer and PowerPoint button	Press <b>Ctrl+H</b> on the keyboard.
Unhide your mouse pointer and PowerPoint button	Press <b>Ctrl+U</b> on the keyboard.
