Baltimore County Police are asking for the public's help in identifying a man wanted for watching a woman inside her ground floor apartment in the 1100-block of Charles View Way, 21204.

On Wednesday, October 4, 2006 at 6:40 a.m., a resident of the apartment building had walked out of the building when he noticed a man couched down next to the ground floor windows of his building. The man was attempting to look into the windows of the apartment. As the resident approached him, he began to run. The resident was able to chase him for a short distance, but lost sight of the man after rounding the corner of the building near Donnington Circle.

Police were able to identify the apartment the man was looking into. The woman in that apartment said she never realized that someone was outside, and did not see him.

Off Campus Second Degree Rape

On Saturday, September 23, 2006, a **Crime Alert** was sent informing the community that the Baltimore Co. Police Department had received a report of a Second Degree Rape.

We have since learned the following: The Baltimore County Police have concluded that an allegation made by a 14-year-old girl being attacked and raped while she was walking in an alley in the 400-block of Chumleigh Road, 21212, in the Precinct 6/Towson area, to be false. She alleged the attack took place on Friday, September 22, at 11:20 p.m., as she was walking to a friend's house in the Rodgers Forge area. She claimed the suspect followed her into an alley behind the Royal Farms Store located in the 7200-block of York Road, 21212. As they walked towards the alley near Chumleigh Road, she told police the suspect forced her to the ground and raped her. Detectives have concluded after forensic examinations and through their interviews and investigation, that the allegation is false. No charges will be placed against the girl.
