ANONYMOUS THREAT ON CAMPUS

Arson 1st Degree

On Saturday, 5-5-07, at 4:11 A.M. a university police officer was on routine patrol in the area of the Residence Tower lobby when he observed the doors to one of the elevators open. The officer observed what appeared to be fire in the elevator. The building's fire alarm system was activated and the fire department was summoned. The fire was extinguished with a fire extinguisher prior to the fire department's arrival. Occupants of the building evacuated to Ward and West Halls.

A representative from the State Fire Marshall's Office responded and determined that the fire was caused by someone setting fire to a piece of Plexiglas covering the electrical panel in the front of the elevator.

There is no suspect information at this time. This case is being investigated by the Towson University Police Department in conjunction with the State Fire Marshall's Office as arson. University procedures for fire and evacuation were successfully implemented. There were no injuries reported. Fire damage was limited to the Plexiglas and electronic panels in the one elevator.
