

Towson's Allied Health Program — Frequently Asked Questions

- **How long will it take me to complete my degree?**

Towson requires a minimum of **120 credits** to graduate. Most Allied Health students **transfer in 64 credits** from their AAS degree.

Total credits required to graduate	120
Less Transfer	- 64
<hr/>	
Credits needed =	56
Most classes =	3 credits
	$56/3 = 18.67$ courses

You can transfer up to an additional 26 credits if they were taken at a 4-year College/University.

If you only transfer in credits from the community college, you will need to complete a minimum of 56 credits at Towson. Since most courses are 3 credits, you would need to **complete approximately 19 courses**.

- **What are other requirements for graduation?**

Towson requires that the **final 30 credits** (of the 120 required to graduate) be **completed at Towson**. A **minimum of 32 upper division credits** (at the 300 or 400 level). A **minimum 2.0** grade in courses in the **major**. A **final grade point average of not less than 2.0**. All **General Education requirements** (GenEd) must be completed (see University Catalogue)

- **Should I schedule a meeting with the Program Director before I submit my application?**

Yes, it is a good idea to meet with the Program Director before you submit your application. **Contact Dr. Braunstein** to make an appointment: **(410-704-4049)**. Please bring a copy your official transcripts, if possible.

- **What are the application deadlines?**

- **What is the process for getting admitted to Towson University?**

Complete the **Transfer Student Application** - <http://www.towson.edu/main/admissions/transfer/applying/> Click on Checklist which will take you to the page that links to the online application. Send in your official transcripts (sealed, signature across the seal) and WES evaluation if you took classes at a foreign university to the Admissions Office. If you meet the qualifications you will receive an acceptance letter that requires a \$300 deposit. After the deposit is received your transcripts will be reviewed. This will determine which, if any, General Education requirements may still need to be completed.
